13.	Reports from Representatives on Outside Bodies Longcake Education Foundation – No meeting. Silloth Coastal Community Team – Any remaining funding after building the cycle path is to be used on a car park at Allonby. There is an issue with flooding on the road along the route of the cycle path which needs to be investigated. Sea Dyke Charity – The old byre has been knocked down and one new shed has been put up. Second shed has been recommended for approval. Last meeting at the cottage had to be cancelled. They were looking to renovate and let it or sell the cottage as it is. There has been a number of enquiries about it. A new robot milker has been bought for the farm which will be installed when new shed has been built. The charity owns Swinsty Farm and provides funding to the Convalescent Home to allow people to access care and give families respite.	
14.	Allerdale & County Councillor Reports No reports received. County Council are starting work at Stanwix corner and are hoping to keep the road open and use traffic lights but they may need to close the road.	
15.	Causewayhead Cemetery Building Leave until Projects Group meeting later.	
16.	Chairman's Announcement The Chairman thanked the Clerk for all that she does and everyone for coming and especially Mark & Geoff.	
17.	Reports from Councillors Cllrs. Betsworth and Orchard were pleased to be at the meeting which they found both light- hearted and a breath of fresh air. Cllr. Wright brought up the condition of West Causewayhead road which is a disgrace with all the mud due to the heavy vehicles using it. The diversion will potentially make it worse. There are big vehicles going to the hangar on the airfield and then going to Aglionby. One particular guy in a tractor and trailer unit is often on his phone. A photograph and registration number of the vehicle would be needed for the Police to do anything. The road is not wide enough to have two big vehicles passing and there were concerns that the road will end up going into the beck. There are cracks in the tarmac now. The road is 60mph and a main bus route and yet the road doesn't even get gritted. There will probably be nothing done until there is an accident. The Parish Council tried to get a width restriction but it was refused. The Parish Council need to keep trying. 6ft 6" width restriction would be better and also ask the question why a 30mph speed limit could not be put in place. It was questioned whether it would be worth asking Harrisons & Armstrongs if they could use the lane in one direction only. There is a lot of sand along the lane and is likely to get worse. Sign at the end of West Causewayhead road is in need of repair, including the sign at Parkhead road which is rusted up and needs painted. Large sign near Seaville road end still needs to be replaced but needs replaced with a smaller sign as the previous one obstructs the view when coming out of the junction.
